SWINDON BRANCH

Swindon Branch Branch members continue to meet monthly and attend various events to publicise the Trust. Our Work Party installed a Sarsen stone to which the plaque commemorating the opening by the Duchess of Cornwall of the Waitrose landing stage had been attached.



Slow progress continues with the new section of canal between E Wichel and Croft Road, where the developers are happy to incorporate this short section into their plans, & build the canal. Another short section is planned, with a lock, to link with the E Wichel section. Volunteers are helping with a newt survey prior to construction. Rod Hacker, on behalf of the Trust, has submitted a document to the recently closed Consultation on Swindon's Local Plan, objecting to the proposal to remove the protected line from the Town Centre. The Branch has a 'wish list' of projects that could be actioned quickly, should funding be available. The Wichelstowe Games raised £3,600 to start preparatory work for the upgrading of the slipway by Beavan's Bridge. If the remainder of the funds can be raised soon Dragonfly can be overhauled & repainted in time to resume trips in April

Inland Waterways Association have confirmed that WBCT have been successful in securing a Water Recovery Group Summer Camp for first 2 weeks in August 2020 at Steppingstones Bridge (West Vale Branch) and, if more work is required for volunteers, Childrey Wharf. Hopefully we can expect up to 20 volunteers each week and will complete the bridge foundation stones and wingwalls. WBCT members can join in too under the WRG supervision. CANAL MAP

At the AGM, the Trust was offered this fascinating map, dated 1795 & describing the 'Wiltshire & Berkshire Canal' - which must mean it was produced before the Act of Parliament was passed. It was felt that it would not be right for Trust funds to be used to purchase it, but Trustees & Exec members clubbed together to buy it.



It is proposed to mount & frame it and make it available to local museums, with the Trust retaining one or two high-resolution copies. Thanks to the Hough family for drawing it to our attention.

FUNDRAISING

The fundraising team, Jaye Tuck and Gordon Olson, met the 7 November deadline for a "Waterways in Progress" funding bid to the Inland Waterways Association. Their chosen project is the rewatering of the 130M length of canal the Trust owns directly alongside Shrivenham Canal Park.

Our bid has been acknowledged and is now with IWA's judging panel. A novel feature of the project is the proposed use of a solar powered pump to keep the stretch in water. How environmentally friendly is that? All are now fully booked, so please don't try to squeeze in at the last minute! The following lovely comment was put on our Facebook page
